

Suggested Materials

This is a general compiled list of materials and tools from all Core studio courses (any section of Drawing 1, 2D, 3D and 4D). This list should prepare you for the beginning of any of the menu of core classes for both semesters of your first year and the items will likely be useful for and required in more than one class, including many studio electives. Expect more material and tool requirements per individual course beyond this list but more than likely many of these items will be on the list in several courses. Use the sharpie to distinctly label all of your materials and tools with name (and phone number on larger items).

Tools

- Tool Box: artbox / shoe box/ fishing box: a sturdy box to hold small tools and supplies
- Xacto #1 or #11 knife and blades
- Push pins (metal only)
- Green rubber cutting matt- self heal- 9x12 or 8x10
- Utility Knife
- Scissors
- Small Pliers
- Assortment of string | thread | or white dental floss
- Sewing needle
- Ruler 16" or 18" thin metal ruler cork back
- Pencils: leads 2H | HB | 2B | 4B | 6B
- Erasers: white plastic, pink pearl, kneaded
- Paint brushes: several flat medium size disposable type + better quality paint brushes: A 1- ¼ flat and a small round brush (nylon is ok, something good for acrylic or watercolor)
- Paint: Basic palette of primaries, black, and white in acrylic or gouache
- Sharpie Pen | Black regular tip
- Fine point ink pen (Stabilo, stylist, etc)
- Assortment of markers (illustration set or water-based brush tip set) or colored pencils
- Drawing board (portable) approx. 23"x26"
- T-Square 24" long
- 18x24 pad of drawing paper (not newsprint)
- Work gloves

- Digital Camera (cell phone or SLR) is useful for generating ideas and will be necessary to use for digital archiving of your work and for some assignments for the class. However a good quality camera can be checked out for free in the media center.

- Portfolio or cardboard taped into a portfolio to fit to 18x24 - 22"x30"

- USB drive -- useful for transferring between classrooms | labs

Materials

- Folders or binders to keep course syllabus, readings and handouts
- Sketchbook, hardbound 9x12 or 11x14
- Magic tape / scotch tape
- Glue stick small (UHU brand is archival)
- Tacky glue (or any white glue)

- 1 roll of 1" non-stick drafting tape
- Roll of 18" tracing paper

- Soft rags/old cut up T-shirts
- Variety of sturdy plastic cups from yogurt, cottage cheese, etc.
